



Walking with God

1. Enoch walked with God.

Genesis 5:24

And Enoch walked with God; and he was not, for God took him.

2. Moses heard the voice of God.

Numbers 7:89

Now when Moses went into the tabernacle of meeting to speak with Him, he heard the voice of One speaking to him from above the mercy seat that was on the ark of the Testimony, from between the two cherubim; thus He spoke to him.

3. Jesus promises another Helper.

John 14:15–18

“If you love Me, keep My commandments. And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever – the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you.

4. God will make His home in us.

John 14:23

Jesus answered and said to him, “If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our home with him.

5. We are the Temple of God.

1 Corinthians 3:16

Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?

6. If we defile this Temple God will destroy us.

1 Corinthians 3:17

If anyone defiles the temple of God, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are.

7. Sexual immorality destroys the Temple.

1 Corinthians 6:18–20

Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body. Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's.

8. The Helper will teach us all things.

John 14:26

But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you.

9. The Helper will testify of Jesus.

John 15:26

“But when the Helper comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will testify of Me.

10. The Helper will convict us of sin, righteousness and judgement.

John 16:7–11

Nevertheless I tell you the truth. It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you; but if I depart, I will send Him to you. And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment: of sin, because they do not believe in Me; of righteousness, because I go to My Father and you see Me no more; of judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.

11. Whatever the Helper hears He will speak and tell us things to come and He will glorify Jesus.

John 16:13–15

However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come. He will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare it to you. All things that the Father has are Mine. Therefore I said that He will take of Mine and declare it to you.

12. Jesus told His disciples to wait in Jerusalem until they received the power of the Holy Spirit.

Luke 24:49

Behold, I send the Promise of My Father upon you; but tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high.”

13. Jesus promised that as the result of receiving the Holy Spirit we would have power to be witnesses to Him throughout the world.

Acts 1:8

But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.”

14. The Holy Spirit came with great power.

Acts 2:1–4

When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

15. How Jesus walked with God.

Acts 2:25

For David says concerning Him: 'I foresaw the LORD always before my face, For He is at my right hand, that I may not be shaken.

16. The mighty power of God within us.

Ephesians 1:17–20

that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him, the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that you may know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the working of His mighty power which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places.

17. Mighty power of God working within us.

Ephesians 3:20

Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us.

18. Keys to walking with God:

1. We must be born-again of the Spirit of God.
2. We must be baptised in the Holy Spirit.
3. Walking in true holiness i.e. abstaining from sin.
4. Reading the word of God daily.
5. Acting upon the Word of God.
6. Believing that God dwells in us.
7. Our body is the Temple of the Holy Spirit.
