



THE MIRACLE WORKING POWER OF THE WORD OF GOD

When Paul was leaving the disciples in Asia to go to Jerusalem he sent a message to the church at Ephesus warning them of dangerous doctrines to come and of people whom he described as savage wolves. He said they would come into the church bringing heresies not sparing the flock.

He also said that from themselves men would rise up speaking perverse things to draw away the disciples after themselves. (Acts 20:30).

Then Paul said, "So now, brethren, I commend you to God and the Word of His grace which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified." (Acts 20:32).

“For the Word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.” (Hebrews 4:12).
